Parent and Guardian Covenant

I. MASS

We will attend Mass with our child/ren each week.

Our child/ren will attend their assigned class-sponsored Mass each month to gain an understanding of what it means to participate in service for the church.

II. ASSIGNMENTS

We will work with our child/ren at home on a weekly basis to complete their assignments. As responsible parents, we will make sure that our children come to class prepared and with their books.

III. ATTENDANCE

We will make sure our child/ren are in attendance each week. If our child/ren are absent due to illness or a family emergency, we will notify the office and be responsible to complete any missed work.

We will adhere to the attendance guidelines that will be made available to us in the 2020-2021 Handbook on the first day of classes.

We are aware that there will be parent meetings throughout the year that we will be asked to attend. We understand these will be listed in the 2020-2021 Handbook handed out on the first day of class.

IV. SUPPORT

We will show support for our volunteer teachers. We understand that they are working diligently to offer our child/ren a supplemental knowledge to that which we are providing in our home.

V. CLASS START DATES/TIMES

We are aware that classes begin on September 12, 2020 and that all classes will take place from 9:30am-12:00pm the first and second Saturday of each month from September-April.

We understand all class dates and times will be listed in the 2020-2021 Handbook we will be receiving the first day of class.

Volunteering

LEADING BY EXAMPLE

Leading by example is a discussion that is often brought up at catechetical meetings. We must remember that children are always watching us and they are often learning to emulate our actions and reaction to the events in our lives. One of the most important things as a catechetical minister is setting an example for the students through the way we teach and participate with one another in the classroom. You can be part of this teaching by participating in student education through many different ways!

TEACHER AIDES

Teacher aides help in the classroom as a facilitator. Aides do not teach the lessons but instead help the teacher by working one-on-one with students during activities, setting up crafts, or gathering supplies.

ASSISTANT CATECHIST

Assistant catechists work alongside another teacher in planning, preparing, and teaching lessons during the Religious Education sessions. By working alongside another teacher, assistant catechists are able to share the work and through this, they demonstrate to their students cooperation and collaboration with others.

Tuition reduction available for assistant catechists with child/ren in the program.

CATECHIST

Catechists take on the responsibility of teacher in the classroom setting. Catechists are in charge of planning, preparing, and instituting lesson plans and activities each week of classes.
